

Property Taxes are Due July 4, 2023. Notices will be mailed out in May





FireSmart Your Property

Did you know that by applying a few simple FireSmart principles, your home and property have a greater chance of withstanding wildfire threats?

You can FireSmart your home by:

- Maintaining your landscape and choosing FireSmart Plants for your yard - The FireSmart Guide to landscaping can be found online.
- Enclosing decks with non-combustible materials to discourage the collection of debris and embers.
- Keeping firewood piles and other items stacked at least 10 meters from your home, especially during wildfire season.
- Ensuring you have a clean, fire-resistant roof and that your eves are clean.
- Enclosing soffits and vents to ensure that embers cannot enter them.
- Removing trees, bushes, and other combustible materials within the first 10 meters surrounding your home (junipers and cedars are particularly combustible).
- Having a wildfire evacuation plan and making sure everyone in your household knows what to do.
